A Talk on "PERSONAL SAFETY AND SECURITY"

I'm pleased to announce that Jeff Sawyer, a retired Metropolitan Police Officer will be coming to talk to us on April 21st about "Personal Safety and Security". I hope this talk will be of interest to members and their partners.

In his talk Jeff will cover the following three main topics, as well as taking questions after his talk.

- The law as it pertains to the use of force in a self-defence context (exactly what you can and *cannot* do in a confrontation under current legislation)
- How to identify and as a result avoid predatory behaviour (the signs that you are being selected as a 'victim' and how to counter that perception)
- How to elicit assistance from bystanders and passers-by (e.g., breaking the 'stranger apathy bond')

In Jeff's words "My commitment to the audience, is that they'll be engaged, educated and, above all, *reassured* by the material I deliver. This presentation won't be alarmist in any way; it's designed to bolster confidence, not steal it."

Jeff has been teaching personal/corporate security and self-protection for 40 years. He has taught internationally throughout Europe, Africa, and the United States. He's a 7th Dan Professor of Jiu-Jitsu and is qualified to teach other martial arts.

This talk is a departure from our normal beekeeping related evening meetings as I'm conscious that most of our talks are specific to beekeepers and are of limited interest to their partners. I hope this talk will be of general interest in the context of the reported level of crime in Hampshire being 13% higher than the UK average, with 39 out of 1000 residents affected by violent and sexual crime.
